Sharing revealing glimpses of the life and works of a French literary genius of the 20th century, this work alternates between moments of glorious recognition and instants of sorrowful intimacy. After the death of her companion Grace Frick, Marguerite Yourcenar falls victim to the real-life seduction of Jerry, a youthful Adonis who succumbs to AIDS. In her late seventies, she reminisces about her life and her fictional characters who become more real to her than her own physical existence. The play touches on the deep mystery of artistic creation.

The playwrights will be in residence, and the French Department is also organizing an afternoon symposium on Yourcenar on Thursday, March 20th in the context of this event.
